Discover Christmas is a workshop aimed at year 2 pupils that is all about the Christmas story. It includes a re-telling of the nativity story as well as interactive opportunities to reflect on the meaning of Christmas. This workshop can be brought to your school and will last for 90 minutes.







Easter Experience is a 90 minute event for pupils in year 4. The first 60 minutes are an interactive performance of the events of Holy Week. At the end, pupils are invited to ask questions to the different characters about the events they witnessed. Easter Experience takes place in three church venues:

These change every half term and are subject to availability.



On an RE day an SSW team member will join school staff to deliver an action-packed, fast-moving day linked to a set RE topic.

We provide all resources and teaching materials and ask to meet relevant staff members before the day to discuss the timetable and provide them with a booklet for the day.

SSW RE days meet the requirements for AT1 (learning about religion) and AT2 (learning from religion).

iwonder spaces help to create time for personal reflection and spiritual development. The SSW team transform a room set aside by the school into a creative and interactive space that provides the children with a place to pause, to wonder and to ask big questions about life, meaning and relationships.

There are four different iwonder spaces to choose from; each of which gives opportunity for the children to reflect inwards at themselves, outwards at the world around them and, if they wish, upwards towards God

- iwonder...what makes me me?
- iwonder...how I should treat other people?
- iwonder...how I feel when...?
- **iwonder**...how we can be a light in the world?
